

Cookie Policy

1. Introduction

1.1 Our website uses cookies.

1.2 Insofar as those cookies are not strictly necessary for the provision of our website and service, we will ask you to consent to our use of cookies when you first visit our website.

2. Document information

2.1 This document has been generated through automated software, and its contents are not legally binding.

2.2 This document explains how Chambers Fletcher Solicitors ('we', 'us', or 'our') uses cookies and similar tracking technologies on our website.

2.3 This document was last updated on 16/07/26.

3. About cookies

3.1 A cookie is a file containing an identifier (a string of letters and numbers) that is sent by a web server to a web browser and is stored by the browser. The identifier is then sent back to the server each time the browser requests a page from the server.

3.2 Cookies may either be "persistent" cookies or "session" cookies. A persistent cookie will be stored by a web browser and will remain valid until its set expiry date, unless deleted by the user before the expiry date; a session cookie, on the other hand, will expire at the end of the user session, when the web browser is closed.

3.3 Cookies may also be "first-party" cookies or "third-party" cookies. A first-party cookie is directly set by our website; a third-party cookie is set by a domain outside of our website.

3.4 Cookies may not contain any information that personally identifies a user, but personal data that we store about you may be linked to the information stored in and obtained from cookies.

4. Cookies we use

4.1 We use cookies for the following purposes:

(a) security - we use cookies as an element of the security measures used to protect user accounts, including preventing fraudulent use of login credentials, and to protect our website and services generally.

(b) analysis - we use cookies to help us to analyse the use and performance of our website and services.

(c) cookie consent - we use cookies to store your preferences in relation to the use of cookies more generally.

(d) marketing – we use cookies to deliver relevant advertising and measure the effectiveness of our marketing campaigns.

5. Cookies used by our service providers

5.1 Our service providers use cookies, and those cookies may be stored on your computer when you visit our website.

5.2 We use Google services, including Google Analytics, Google Tag Manager and Google Ads. Google gathers information about the use of our website by means of cookies. The information gathered is used to create reports about the use of our website. 5.3 From time to time, additional services may be provided through the website.

6. Managing cookies
